All along the route from New York they were received with due honors by the Catholics of the several places where the cars stopped.

THE AUSTRALIAN COLONIES. - These seem to be in a prosperous condition. Both in New South Wales, and in Victoria, the annual revenue is increasing, and is largely in excess of the annual expenditure, which is steadily diminishiog. The revenue averages about \$22 per. head of population per annum. In the City of Melbourne alone, of surplus stock, about 50,000 fat sheep are slaughtered every week for exportation to England in the form of tallow and preserved meats. Large numbers of horned cattle share the same fate; but in spite of this large consumption, the Melbourne Argus observes that "the supply of meat seems inexhaustible," and that prices have undergone to change, alslarted, " has required some 25.000 fat sheep, and a proportionate number of fat cattle, over and above what used to serve at our weekly markets." Certainly the material conditions of Australia and Canada are very dissimilar.
