CAP. XV.

An Act authorizing the Legislative Council and House of Assembly to commit prisoners in contempt to the common jail of Queen's County.

[Passed April 21, 1863.]

BE it enacted by the Lieutenant Governor, Council and Assembly, as follows:

I. That from and after the passing of this Act the common jail of the County of Queen's, shall be the prison of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly of this Island.

Queen's County jail to be prison for Houses of Legislature.

II. The said Legislative Council and House of Assembly shall have full power to commit to such prison any person or persons who shall, by resolution of the said Legislative of contempt Council or House of Assembly, be adjudged guilty of any to be commitcontempt or breach of the privileges of the said Legislative Council or House of Assembly respectively, in as full and ample a manner as persons adjudged guilty of such offences might, before the passing of this Act, be committed to the custody of the Sergeant-at-Arms of the said Legislative Council or House of Assembly, respectively.

Persons adjudged guilty ted to such prison.

III. It shall be the duty of the keeper of the common jail Jailer's duty of the said County of Queen's, to receive into his custody, and confine in such jail all such persons as shall at any time hereafter be committed to such jail under and by virtue of any warrant signed by the President of the Legislative Council or by the Speaker of the House of Assembly of this Island.

IV. All Justices of the Peace, Sheriffs, Deputy Sheriffs, Duty of Magis-Jailers, Constables, and other officers, shall be aiding and trates, &c. &c assisting the said Legislative Council and House of Assembly and their officers in the exercise of the jurisdiction of the said Legislative Council and House of Assembly, whenever required so to do.

CAP. XVI.

An Act to incorporate sundry persons by the name of the President, Directors and Company of the Farmers' Bank of Rustico.

[Passed April 21, 1863.]
