SNIDER, GEORGE. [*North Grey.*]

Grandfather emigrated from Germany to British Colonies in Am. in the 18th century. S of Martin Snider, a native of Pennsylvania, and a U.E. loyalist, who served on the loyal side during the Am. revolution, was taken prisoner, but escaped and made his way to N.B., and thence to U.C. B. at Eglinton, Ont., 31 Jan., 1813. Ed. in Toronto. M., 1835, Jane, dau. of the late Joseph Maughan, of Northumberland, Eng. Was local agent for the sale of Crown Lands on Toronto and Sydenham Road, 1848 to 1850; Crown Lands agent, same place, from latter date to 1854; and Sheriff of Grey from Dec., 1853, to June, 1863, when he resigned that office. Has been Presdt. of Mechanics' Institute of Owen Sound, and of the County Agricultural Society. Elected Mayor of Owen Sound, which office he held for a previous term, 1870. Was an unsuccessful candidate for Grey in Can. Assembly, at g.e., 1863. First returned to Parlt. for present seat at g.e., 1867, and elected at last g.e. A Liberal; opposed to present Govt.—*Fairview Cottage, Owen Sound, Ont.*
