BILL.

An Act for the better protection of Sheep in Upper Canada.

HER Majesty, by and with the consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of Canada, enacts as follows:

 It shall be lawful for the owner of any sheep, or for any per-Owner of son having, for the time being, the care or custody of any sheep, to kill dogs worryo any dog in the act of pursuing or worrying such sheep elsewhere than ing them. on land belonging to the owner of such dog.

2. On complaint made in writing and on oath before any Justice Owner of dog of the Peace, for any city, town or county, or union of coun-that worries 10 ties in Upper Canada, that any person residing in such city, county or summoned to union of counties, owns a dog there which has pursued or worried any answer comsheep elsewhere than on land belonging to its owner, such Justice of plaint thereof. the Peace may issue his summons directed to such person, stating

shortly the matter of such complaint, and requiring him to appear at a 15 certain time and place, before the same Justice, or before such other Justice of the same city, county, or united counties, as may then be there, to answer to the said complaint, and to be further dealt with according to law.

3. The proceedings on such complaint and summous shall be regu-Froceedings 20 lated by the Act "respecting the duties of Justices of the Peace out of on such com-"Sessions, in relation to summary convictions and orders," which shall plaint. apply to cases under this Act.

4. In case any person is convicted, on the oath of one credible Justice may witness other than the complainant of owning a dog which has pursued for killing of 25 and worried any sheep elsewhere than on land belonging to its owner, dog, ac. the Justice of the Peace may make an order for the killing of such dog (describing the same according to the tenor of the description given in the complaint and in the evidence) within such time not exceeding

days, as he may see fit, and in default thereof for the commitment 30 of the defendant to prison for not less than nor more than days, for not obeying such order, and for the killing of such dog by a constable or other person named in such order.

5. It shall not be necessary for the plaintiff in any action of damages Owners of for injury done by a dog to sheep to prove that the defendant was aware dogsliable for 35 of the propensity of the dog to pursue and injure sheep; nor shall the by them to liability of the owner of any dog in damages for any injury done by such sheep. dog to any sheep depend upon his previous knowledge of the propensity of such dog to injure sheep.

6. No conviction under this Act shall be a bar to any action by the Conviction no 40 owner of any sheep for the recovery of damages for the injury done to bar to action such sheep on the occasion in respect of which such conviction is had.
