An Act to authorize the Lieutenant Governor of Prince Edward Island to sell certain Pews in Saint Paul's Church, Charlottetown, now held by the government.

[Passed April 21, 1863.]

WHEREAS the congregation of Saint Paul's Church, Preamble. Charlottetown, have offered to purchase the government pews in the said church, known as the Council pew, the Assembly pew, and the military pew, for the sum of one hundred pounds and to keep the pew in the said church known as the Governor's, hereafter for the use of thex Lieutenant Governor (for the time being) and his family free of assessment chargeable thereon either against the Government or the Lieutenant Governor Be it therefore enacted by the Lieutenant Governor, Council and Assembly, as follows:
