

Bryan Fryer still number one—nine times

Bryan Fryer may have lost the career points record to Steve Kasowski this weekend, but don't feel too badly for the former Bear and Eskimo standout. He still holds nine Golden Bear records, including all four major receivers' marks.

Fryer leads in career catches (136) and receiving yards (2655). Most of those totals were racked up in 1974-75. In 1974 Fryer caught 58 balls for 1068 yards, and in 1975 he caught 51 passes for 943 yards. Those remain the top two seasons ever by any Golden Bear receiver.

In 1974, Fryer also scored 16 of his 34 career touchdowns, both Bear marks. His 98 points that year are also a record.

Lest you think of him only as a pass-catcher, Fryer ran for an 8.5 yard per carry average in 1973, and returned kickoffs for 366 yards in 1975, both single season marks.

Bryan Fryer looks to be in the University of Alberta record book for a long while yet.

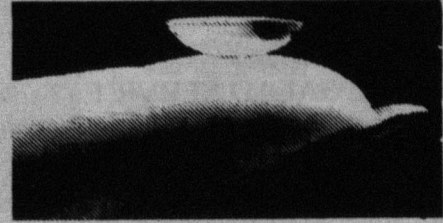
