

Ron Searle ends P.C. speculations

Councillor Ron Searle of Mississauga will not abandon Ward Seven to stand for federal nomination.

He ended the speculation that he would be contesting the nomination for Progressive Conservative candidate at the coming nomination meeting of the South Peel Federal Association in his inaugural address at Port Credit Secondary School Jan. 12.

Mr. Searle's name had been prominently coupled

with those of Rodney Pinkney of Clarkson and Don Blenkairn of Port Credit as probable candidates.

the last Tory contestant for the federal riding of Peel, which before the recent redistribution extended north to the Town of Orangeville. The new, smaller riding of Peel South is bounded on the north by Steele's Avenue and encompasses all the land within the municipal boundaries of Mississauga plus Streetsville and Port Credit.

Mr. Searle limited his inaugural remarks to a tribute to all those members of previous Township of Toronto councils who had laid the groundwork for the foundation of the new Town of Mississauga and an announcement that he would not desert municipal govern-

ment to seek higher office.

"There has been considerable conjecture in the local press, and elsewhere," said Mr. Searle, "that I would be seeking the nomination to carry the Tory banner in the next federal election, and some speculation that I would leave local politics.

"I have just received my second acclamation to this Council," he said, "and two competent men who were prepared to contest my seat in the ward in the event that I ran for reeve, stood down and expressed their confidence in me. I believe I owe it to them, and to the people of my ward and

the town, to state here and now that I have no intention of contesting this or any other Federal nomination within the term of this Council."

Mr. Searle turned to the provincial cabinet members, and Bruce Beer M.P. and added, "If the honorable members will forgive me the observation, I can conceive of no honour more challeng-

ing or rewarding than serving the residents of the new Town of Mississauga, on their council and God willing, I will continue to serve in that capacity."

The Peel South Federal nomination has since that date been rescheduled for some time in June with Mr. Pinkney and Mr. Blenkairn the remaining declared candidates.

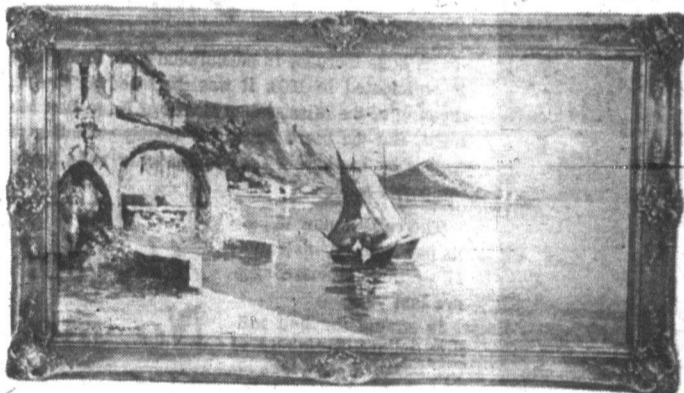
