Sir,-

I am enclosing herewith the Annuity pay-lists from Isle a la Crosse Agency for 1925, together with cheque No. 19639 amounting to \$345.00, made up as follows,-

The collection of \$5.00 was in connection with a halfbreed boy in the Beauval School, the step-son of George Grosventze No. 63 Clear Lake Band. This boy I was informed last year was a treaty Indian and was paid treaty. This year the man spoke to the paying Agent, Mr. Taylor, about his step-daughter, who was in school also, and asked that treaty be paid her. Upon enquiring very closely into the matter it was found that these children were halfbreeds; Mr. Taylor therefore collected from the step-father the \$5.00 that had been paid for the boy last year.
