SARNIA, C. W.

The chief town of the county of Lambton, situated in the township of Sarnia, at the upper end of the River St. Clair, near its junction with Lake Huron. It is immediately opposite the city of Port Huron, State of Michigan, with which it has constant communication by a steam ferry at all seasons of the year, the navigation at this point never being obstructed by ice. Sarnia was laid out in the year 1833, and has been gradually growing in size and importance. It contains several steam mills, one foundry, and other manufacturing facilities, and an enterprising class of merchants. With an excellent harbor, and its unsurpassed means of intercourse by rail and water, it will doubtless become a place of considerable importance. Distance from London by the London and Sarnia branch of the Great Western Railway, (which connects with the main line at Komoka, 10½ miles west of London,) 60 miles; from Detroit (to which place first class steamers run daily during the season of navigation), 60 miles; from Chatham, *via* Wallaceburg, 60 miles; from Goderich, 65 miles, to which place there are regular lines of boats. Mails daily. Population, 2022, according to census of 1861.
