





immarizing his argument against vomment's proposal Sir Wilfrid In sun s proposal Sir Wilfrid Laurier stated that the Liberals when in proposed to help its lines in the Northern to link Prairie Provinces with Eastern Canada The present government, however, had one one step further and had assisted the railway in their extension of the vstem thru British Columbia. Aid for this portion of the project had been re fused by his own administration. In British Columbia for 340 miles the rail of the C.P.R. and the Canadian North ern are never more than three miles apart. The British Columbia line should not have been subsidized at all under existing circumstances. For the rest of the line he was most enthusiastic. He that his amendment, if adopted, would give the government absolute control of the enterprise.

The reply was made by Hon, L. P. Pelletier, who said that the amendment was couched in very vague terms. To his mind there was no doubt that the course which the government had decided upon was the preferable one, because all the noney which this country can vote at very session of parliament was needed to put Canada on'a proper footing. He believed that the country would hai with satisfaction the provision in the agreement that the trade of Canada originating in the west should be carried to Canadian ports. He thought that see tion of the bill to be one of the para mount elements which would keep the country united in one sentiment so that both east and west would have in their mind the future greatness of the coun try. Mr. Pelletier believed that the agreement would mark a turning point in the history of Transportation in Canada and that in future the government would have more control over the railways. Sir Wilfrid's amendment was defeated on a vote of 85 to 42, a government majority of 43.

The final stage of the fight was reached when Alphonse Verville, Labor-Liberal, moved that the bill should ot come into effect until Mackenzie and Mann shall have agreed to a board of conciliation to deal with the coal strike in the mines in which they are interest ed on Vancouver Island. On behalf of the government, it was maintained that Mackenzie and Mann do not control these mines, altho they may have an in terest in them. The amendment was re jected by 85 to 38, a government ma crity of 47 and the three weeks' fight on the measure was over.


At the time of writing the bill is under consideration in the Senate, where it is expected to be disposed of in the course of a few days.

Senate Discusses Bank Interest

Ottawa, June 7 .- In the Upper mouse, on Saturday, Senator Power stated that he desired to call attention to the illibway in which depositors in Cana dian banks are dealt with, and asked if was the intention of the government to increase the rate of interest on de posits in the post-office and government avings banks. He was of the opinion that the banks could afford to pay more interest, and now, when people were feeling the pinch of hard times, would be a peculiarly appropriate time to inrease the rate for the benefit of the depositors. The banks of Canada give their depositors 3 per cent., while they loan for 7 or 8 per cent. 
