

Canadian Library for the Blind

Rules and Regulations.

1. Books shall be sent free of charge to any person in Canada forwarding a certificate duly signed by an approved party or one dollar, as surety for the good care and safe return of books.

2. No person shall be allowed more than one vol. at a time, except books of reference which may be issued for any length of time at the discretion of the librarian.

3. Books must be returned promptly at the time specified.

4. Any person who shall injure, destroy, or lose any of the books shall be charged with the total amount of the damage done.

5. No person, by whom any fine, or other charge is due, and to whom notice thereof has been sent, shall, until payment is made be allowed any books.

6. No book shall be considered as returned unless it is received at the Markham P. O.

7. Moneys received as sureties, fines, etc., shall not at any time be refunded, but shall be applied to the purchase of books.

8. N. B.—Persons returning books must address clearly, "Books for the Blind, Post Free." Neglect of this causes the books to be sent to the dead-letter office, and double postage to be paid; the books are heavy, and all such costs shall be charged against the person violating this rule.
