Machine Guns "Made in Britain"

for the Offensive Could now Be Produced. Mr. Edwin Samuel Montagu, Minister of Munitions, tells the House of Commons.

...in regard to machine guns. Already, he said, she was sending large amounts of guns and munitions to her allies and in addition was sending to France one third of her production of shell steel and transferring to her allies metals necessary for munitions to the amount of 6,000,000 pounds monthly. The production of machine guns for the allies was being increased in four days, he declared, as such heavier munition as was produced during the whole of last year, while there were being turned out as many heavy guns as were in existence when the ministry of munitions was formed, and this number would soon be nearly doubled.

The output of machine guns had increased fourteen-fold, continued the minister and there could be turned out in four weeks as many of these implements as existed at the formation of the ministry. The output of high explosives was 60 times as great as a year ago.



JAPAN SUPPLIES MUNITIONS AND ARMS TO RUSSIA

Clothes Also, Many Muscovites Having Whole Uniform Made in Japan.

RUSSIAN OFFICERS DIRECT FIRE.

Learn from Japanese Experts How to Use the Great 12-inch Guns.

By Special Wire to the Courier. Paris, Aug. 16.—(Correspondent of the Associated Press)—The extent to which Japan is clothing, shoeing, arming and munitioning the Russian army was forcibly presented to a military observer who has just returned from a trip along the Russian front.

"I was astonished," he said, "to find great numbers of Russian soldiers clothed from head to foot in uniforms made in Japan. So that the tunics and trousers, but even the leggings, they carried on their shoulders Japanese guns. Their cartridge belts were filled with cartridges made in Japan. Their leather belts and buckles were from Japan. And the stout hob-nail shoes they wear are from hides gathered in Korea and made into shoes in Japan. So that the Russian soldier in Japanese clothes, Japanese shoes, with a Japanese gun, Japanese ammunition and Japanese accoutrements."

Korea Fine Grazing Country "It is strange," he went on, "that Russia went to war with Japan over Korea, and now Korea, the source of all the trouble, is supplying the raw materials in which her soldiers are marching to victory. Korea is a great grazing country, and is proving a vast reservoir of raw hides which the Japanese are rapidly turning into boots, saddles and leather furnishings."

"How did these supplies get from Japan to the Russian front?" the observer was asked.

"Subs Could Not Harm "It was noted," said he, "that the only vital point where the Germans had not been able to send their submarines was in the Straits of Korea, and the Sea of Japan. These are the waters separating Japan from Russia and the Asiatic mainland and the routes over them, commercial and military, are open and without menace."

"What sort of arms and munition is Russia getting from Japan?" was asked.

"All sorts of arms" was the reply, "from the service rifle and small field pieces up to the big 12-inch guns. The Japanese 12-inch is a terrible weapon, and they are content not to make any of the 14-inch and 16-inch guns, as they consider from a military standpoint that immobility of the monster guns offsets its advantages, whereas the 12-inch is a mobile gun and very deadly."

"It is said that French and Japanese are now furnishing the expert direction of the Russian artillery fire, which has made it so effective. Did you see any of these officers?" was asked.
