

Our little pack nomis were well loaded with books and medicines and a little foreign food. The weather was still cold, and, although we were quite well equipped, we suffered considerably. One cold morning we came to a man lying in the road. At first we thought he was sick or drunk, but upon closer examination we found he was dead, and frozen stiff. The natives passed by without paying any attention to what seemed to ue such a terrible sight. We tried to find out all we could about the case, and learned that the poor man had been sick was without house or friends, and being unable to go farther and as the night was bitter cold, he had frozen to death. When the sick are without friends here, they have a hard time; often they are put out on the city wall to die, and frequently we find them before it is too late and take them to the hospital where they are clothed and fed, and with proper treatment in a good room, they soon recover. Many precious lives are saved in this way and led to Christ.

We travelled about 30 miles cach day, and as our pack ponies could not go fast, we walked most of the time in order to keep warm. Upon arriving at the inns often we would find them very cold, and at other times too hot. The vermin troubled us a great deal, although not so much as in warm weather. The diet was very unpalatable, but hunger soon enabled us to consume a good portion.

comprising the tract lying east of the Georgian Bay, some 40 townships in all, an area as large as the Kingdom of Belgrum and five times as large as Prince Edward Island, is full of lakes, the three leggest—Muskoka, Rosseau and Joseph—are the favorites. They lie contiguous to each other, and the steamboat route passes through all of them. Their surface is studded with islands, most of which have been pre-empted, and summer cottages peep out from among the trees on every hand. During the season the summer hotels and boarding houses are always full, but their harvest is short, the Muskoka. Season lasting only a month or six weeks. But many of the cottagers arrive early and leave late, so that from May till October there is plenty of life, and the supply boar's which call almost daily, do a thriving trade.

Leaving Gravenhurst, the gateway of Muckoka, at the south end of Lake Muskoka, with its numerous sawmills, the steamer, after a run of a mile or two, passes through the narrows, where one might almost jump ashore on either side, and then enters the broad expanse of the lake, some 20 miles long and about nine wide. About 10 miles up, the Muskoka River enters from the cast, through two mouths. Bracebridge is a town of considerable importance, as it is the judicial seat for the district. It has two very large tameries, which have been located here on

account of the facilities for obtaining hemlock bark. The settlers on the lakes derive

We cannot linger to explore the many bays and recesses of Lake Rosseau, the delight of the camper and explorer, but must hurry on to Lake Joseph. This is reached from the lower end of Lake Rosseau through a cut in a sand bar a few yards wide, at Port Sandfield, which admits us



In the ontario highlands,—sphink rock, into the extreme southern end of Joseph. The natural outlet for the lake is the Joseph River, which flows out of an arm to the east, about half way down. The river is too shallow for steamers, so the cut was made by the Government, and gives the tourist the benefit of a trip through the entire length of what is generally considered the finest of the lakes. Its level was formerly about two feet above that of Rosseau, but the cut has lowered it to that extent.

Lake Joseph is 16 miles long, but is so out up with bays and inlets that its width varies from less than a quarter of a mile to five or six miles. Its surface is studded with beautiful islands, varying in size from a few square yards to several hundred acres. Its water, though dark, is clearer than in the other lakes, and when its surface is unrufied the entline of every object to a great depth is clearly defined. It was to Lake Joseph the original Muskoka Club resort d, and their favorite camping-ground still-bears the name they gave it. Yohocacha sounds uncommonly like an Indian name, and yet it is simply made up of the first two letters of the names of the five gentlemen who owned it.
