Apart from the feeding of the cows there is the question of water and shade supply. Both are very necessary. When sufficient protection from the files, in the form of shade or underbrush, is not to be found, it would be advisable to keep the animals in the stable during the hotter part of the day, allowing them out in the evening. Where supplementary feed has to be cut and hauled to the cows less waste will be occasioned when fed while inside. Where the cows of necessity have to be out all day they should have protection from the files by spraying with some good fly repellant.
