## TURN TO THE RIGHT!

A short time ago this journal called  
the attention of the public to the  
fact that the placing of double doors  
at the King street entrance to the  
Post Office was not a matter of  
chance or accident. It was done with  
a purpose. There are two entrances  
facing on King St., and there are  
double doors at each entrance. The  
intention of the architect, who de-  
signed the building was that half of  
the entrance should be used as an  
entrance and the other half as an  
exit.

When the principle of turning to  
the right is put into general use, it  
does not require more than the ordi-  
nary amount of intelligence for peo-  
ple to understand that the half of  
the entrance nearest the Rankin  
House should be used as an exit, and  
the other half as an entrance.

For a time the people did turn to  
the right, but now it is reported that  
they are getting careless. A word  
of warning might not be amiss. It  
might help matters considerably if  
the post office authorities would get  
the words, "in" and "out" placed on  
the proper doors.
