1. Curtailing the number of appeals.

practicable and reasonable, salaries instead of fees.

4. Rendering it legal and optional for both client and solicitor to make a defi-nite bargain binding both whereby a solicitor should be paid a definite and fixed sum for the conduct of litigation. instead of the present uncertain, indefi-nite and unsatisfactory method, which tends to greatly increase the cost of liti-
