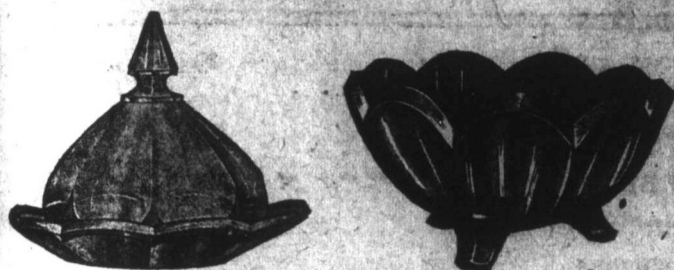

Nationalization of Mines Defeated

MacLaren Reaches Calcutta -- Newfoundland Schooner Lost Near New Waterford -- Sleeping Sickness Increases in Great Britain.

NATIONALIZATION OF MINES DEFEATED.

LONDON, May 16. The House of Commons to-day rejected the Mines Nationalisation Bill by a vote of 264 to 168.

SLEEPING SICKNESS IN BRITAIN INCREASING.

LONDON, May 16. The sleeping sickness epidemic is on the increase in Great Britain. The largest number of cases, since the epidemic commenced, was last week, when 290 cases were reported from England and Wales.

MACLAREN AT CALCUTTA.

SHANGHAI, May 16. Stuart MacLaren, British airman attempting to encircle the world, arrived to-day at Calcutta from Alghahad, according to a despatch received here. He plans a halt at Calcutta until next Wednesday, in order to overhaul his machine and install a new engine.

N.F.L.D. SCHOONER LOST.

SYDNEY, May 16. The Newfoundland schooner *Ida*, 27 tons, struck submerged ice last night, while three miles off New Waterford, and sank in two minutes, the water gushing through a seven foot gash in the side of the vessel. The *Ida* was in ballast from Fortuna, to Summerside, P.E.I., for a cargo of produce. Captain George Walters and his two seamen, Morgan Thornhill and Daniel B. Langdon, escaped from the vessel in a dory.

FRENCH AIRMAN HONORED.

PARIS, May 16. **Lieut. Pelletier D'Oisy**, French aviator, flying from Paris to Tokio, to-day was promoted to a Captaincy. Sergeant Bessin, who is D'Oisy's mechanic, was awarded the Military Medal.

JAPANESE VILLAGE DESTROYED BY FIRE.

TOKIO, May 16. The village of Machinche, close to Minato, was virtually wiped out to-day by fire, which destroyed 2,000 homes, including all public buildings and banks in the business district.

GREAT BRITAIN SLIDING EASTWARD.

LONDON, May 16. The Island of Great Britain is sliding eastward and has tilted several feet in that direction within the last three hundred years. This announcement was made by C. H. J. Clayton, recently, in a paper read before the Society of Engineers, at Burlington House.

ATTEMPTED MURDER CHINESE FOREIGN MINISTER.

PEKIN, May 16. A box which an unknown messenger brought to-day as a gift to Dr. Wellington Koo, Foreign Minister, exploded, and critically injured the servants whom the Minister ordered to open it. Dr. Koo himself was unhurt.

SIDE TALKS.

WHAT MAKES BULLIES?

Do you know of anyone who would not develop into a bully if someone offered himself or herself to be bullied?

If you probably think you do. Someone with a very sweet, patient, easy going disposition. Someone who allows the other members of the family to put it all over him or her. But hasn't that sweet, patient, unselfish disposition been developed because that somebody you are thinking of lives among people who are less patient and unselfish and who, by reason of various circumstances have, to use a slang expression, the drop on her?

Then you'd find out. If you could put him—or more likely her,—into a position where someone else with a naturally giving-in disposition was completely in her power, then you would find out whether you knew anyone who would not develop into a bully if someone offered himself to be bullied.

We are all strongly self-centered by instinct. If it were not so the race would hardly have survived. We are egotists, we want our own way, we want to dominate. Circumstances alter and modify this but soon as circumstances are favorable to it the instinct rises up.

I do not believe there is any temptation in the world stronger than the temptation to tyrannize if someone will let you. It takes ten times the character not to tyrannize when you have the power to do so, than it does to be unselfish and a giver-in when a stronger character is trying to dominate you.

Patience Or Cowardice. I know a woman who used to complain because her husband was of a tyrannical, bullying disposition, the kind of whom George Eliott writes: "he had one of the worse habits you can imagine which was to think that everything annoying that happened to him was my fault." Toward her husband this woman was placating and just suffering because she had to be or fight. She thought, her patience was a virtue. I am not sure it wasn't cowardice. Anyway it was nothing more than a result. For after her husband died she had her father and mother to live with her. And how she did bully those two old people who were in her power both financially and emotionally!

A Standard of Our Civilization. All of which is not meant as a justification of bullying or tyranny. There's something in each of us that drives us to bully people. And there's something in us that knows that is not decent and that fights against it. And the more civilized and secure and decent people are, the more strongly

they throw their wills on the side of the something that fights against the wish to bully.

No, far be it from me to want to justify bullying. But maybe it will help a bit if we all understand this instinct in ourselves and others, and are not too quick to blame others or pat ourselves on the back.
