

LONDON, Oct. 28.—The British press, aroused by accounts of extensive casualties in the suppression of last week's insurrection in Damascus, is strongly critical today of General Sarrail, the French High Commissioner in Syria. Among other things, his reported attempt to overawe the rebels by parading the corpses of executed brigades on camel back through the streets of the city is sharply condemned.



DESTRUCTIVE DUST

Forty-five lives were lost, twenty-eight employees were injured, and approximately \$2,000,000 worth of property was destroyed in dust explosions and the resulting fires in the United States during the past year. It is disclosed by statistics compiled by Hylton R. Brown, of the U.S. Bureau of Chemistry, and made public through one of the American Chemical Society's press bulletins. There are in this country, according to the summary, 42,000 establishments manufacturing dusty products, such as starch, feed, cocoa, spices, and sugar; or producing dust during the manufacture of wooden ware, aluminum ware, corks, etc. The Bureau has developed preventive measures for hazards common to all plants, but it warns that individual hazards must be thoroughly studied. Says Mr. Brown: "Investigations by the Bureau of Chemistry of the Department of Agriculture have shown that practically all combustible dusts, and some dusts not generally considered combustible, will explode with violence
