

MEXICANS WOULD HAVE DIAZ AS PRESIDENT

Petition Asking Iron Man to Come Back and Assume Republic's Head

Aged Ruler Sends Word That if His People Want Him He Will Come Back

Mexico City, Sept. 25.—A secret petition asking that Gen. Porfirio Diaz return, take over the combined federal and rebel armies and seize the presidency of Mexico is being circulated here.

Teofilo Gracia, former member of the household staff of former President Diaz, has received a letter from the aged general, who is now at Biarritz, France, in which the former president of Mexico says:

"If the people of Mexico make manifest to me their desire that I should return to aid in the re-establishment of law, order and government in the fatherland, I will respond to their request."

Letter Widely Circulated. The letter has been copied and circulated, and is partly responsible for the pro-Diaz demonstrations of September 16 and 17. So many have read the letter that Madero does not dare take action against Gracia for making public the former president's words.

President Francisco Madero will not accept the terms of peace in Mexico, Jr., that terms of peace in Mexico be submitted to and considered by a commission made up of representatives of the government, the revolutionary armies and the independent civil elements of Mexico.

Orozco's peace proposal was made in a letter written by A. Gomez Robelo, his personal representative, to President Madero on September 19. Madero's rejection of the peace offer is made known in a telegram to the International News Service, which has received the president of the republic's request for information as to whether Robelo's letter had been answered.

Madero's reply follows: "City of Mexico, Sept. 21.—To the editor of the International News Service: Letter is not answered because proposition is not acceptable."

Wilson Ignores Madero. American Ambassador Henry Lane Wilson, ignoring the federal government of Mexico, today made a peremptory demand on Gov. Matias Gorda, of the state of Tamaulipas, for the immediate release from jail at Tampico of W. C. Nichols.

Discussing his action, the ambassador declared that he had been instructed by Washington to use whatever force he deemed necessary to obtain Nichols' release and that he intended to proceed to Tampico if it should become necessary to land some of the 250 marines on board the United States cruiser the Mines in Tampico harbor.

Nichols is accused of shooting and killing Vasquez Ceballos, a bandit, on whom he had a reward had been placed and whom Nichols had been authorized to arrest. The American who is a well-known fruit raiser of Tampico, was arrested six months ago, since which time a Mexican has confessed to the killing of Ceballos. Notwithstanding this confession, Nichols is still confined in a small, filthy, vermin-infested cell in the Tampico jail, while the effort is being made by the authorities to bring him to trial. The Mexican who confessed was not even arrested.

DE LA BARRA ADVOCATED AS MADERO'S SUCCESSOR

Washington, Sept. 21.—Mexican rebels have looted Laguna Hacienda, belonging to the American branch of the Rothschild family, in the state of Michoacan, according to a bulletin received by the state department late today from United States Consul Claude Guyant at Acapulco, a port on the west coast of Mexico. The rebels got a number of horses and \$4,000 in cash and kidnapped the ranch foreman and his wife to hold them for ransom. Cuernavaca and La Union, two towns on the west coast, have been taken by the rebels.

Advices from Mexico City are that a special train carrying road supplies got through to Cuernavaca, 60 miles from Mexico City, September 19. Cuernavaca, which is the capital of the state of Morelos and a city of 60,000 inhabitants, has not been besieged, but a strong cord of rebels under Zapata surrounds Mexico City and it has been impossible to run trains southward from the Mexican city without Zapata's permission.

Santiago Camarero and two hundred federal soldiers, the garrison of El Tule, yesterday revolted and joined Campa's rebel army. The most interesting feature of these bulletins is that the Mexican government considers it a great feat that the supply train succeeded in reaching a point sixty miles from the national capital without being captured by the rebels.

MEXICAN REBELS LOOT RANCH OF ROTHSCHILDS

El Paso, Texas, Sept. 21.—Reports that the various elements of the Mexican rebels have agreed on a programme of action were given credit tonight when Juan Pedro Didapp, Washington representative of the Zapistas, declared all the factions were ready to support the pretensions of Francisco de la Barra, former Mexican minister to the United States. Didapp says he will confer with the Orozco Junta here. He expresses confidence that De la Barra will be Madero's successor.

Dispatches were received tonight confirming exact details from Arizona that Gen. Emilio Campa, rebel leader in the Altar district of Sonora, had abandoned his command while it was in full flight before Colonel Girones' federal. The federal were close behind Campa's soldiers in full flight, following a crushing defeat when the rebels met an American named Hockersworth in an automobile. Campa forced Hockersworth to drive him out of danger, leaving his troops to get their own predicament as best they could.

Reports continue of elaborate preparations by the rebels, 2,000 strong, to attack Acua Prieta in Ariz., but most of them are not serious. The latter

report is that the rebel attack will begin Monday.

REBELS THREATEN TO CAPTURE AGUA PRIETA

Arizona, Sept. 21.—Orozco's showing activity and strength all along the border today. General Rojas and General Salazar with 2,400 men, mostly mounted, have combined 15 miles from Acua Prieta and are marching to the attack of that city. Colonel Obregon is in command of 650 federal in Acua Prieta, but they are short of ammunition and worn out with fighting Salazar's men for several days and it is not believed they can hold out against the superior rebel force.

Pasqual Orozco, with 1,500 men, is encamped four miles from Juarez at a water hole in the hills where he is awaiting reinforcements from Tamaulipas. Orozco announces that when those men arrive he will attack Juarez again.

Heirs Weds Bellboy. Cincinnati, Sept. 24.—Robert Utter, 18 years old, a bellboy in Charles P. Taft's fashionable Hotel Sinton in this city, eloped to the Kentucky side with Miss Emma Levy, an heiress of Sintonville, W. Va. When the girl's mother, a society leader of West Vir-

ginia, learned of their marriage, she rushed to Dayton to seek legal aid to annul it. They followed her and won her forgiveness. Then she sent them on their way to Chicago to spend their honeymoon. The acquaintance of the pair began a few days ago at the Sinton, where the Levys were guests and Utter waited on them.
