Pliny makes no mention of a discharge of lava at that time, and scientists incline to the opinion that the material deposited over the cities destroyed was of a fragmentary charscter, and that the meited rock which has been given forth in modern time, was then entirely absent. Authorities differ as to the number of lives lost at that time, but the consensus of opinion seems to point to nine-tenths of the total population of Pompeii alone, estimated at 20,000 souls.

This eruption completely changed the outline of the mountain, but half of the walls of the ancient crater remaining, the south and west having been blown away or crumbled.

The next recorded outbreak after that of 79 occurred in the year 203 described as a great conflagration, in 472, an eruption of great violence destroyed the villages which had been built on the sites of the buried cities of Herculaneum and Pompeil.
