Berlin, Jan. 19 .- The romantic mariage in London today of Baroness von Schoenbeck, heroine of the famous Allenstein garrison murder on Christmas eve, 1907, to A. O. Weber, foremost satirical artist of Berlin, has created a great sensation here. Major on Schoenbeck, an artillery officer, was murdered in the garrison on the date mentioned by Capt. von Goeben, another army officer, who was the lover of Frau von Schoenbeck.

Capt, von Goeben was arrested immediately after the crime. At first he stoutly maintained his innocence, but later broke down and made a complete confession, in which he incriminated the baroness.
