

HUMAN TARGETS

Hail of Bullets From Fortress Sweeps
Across Ship's Deck.

Pensacola, Fla., May 25.—Coming within range of the rifles of a target squad from Fort Barrancas, Edgar Amo-is-on, a seaman aboard the three-masted schooner John W. Kewn, mortally wounded late yesterday and others aboard escaped death or serious injury by quickly hiding behind the masts and other rigging of the vessel.

The Kewn was passing the harbor when a rain of leaden missiles swept over the deck.

Col. Allen, commanding the post, has ordered an investigation.

RECALLS SNELL MURDER.

Chicago, May 25.—Albert J. Snell, son of the millionaire, Amos J. Snell, whose murder here in 1888 created a widespread sensation, was found dead at a cheap rooming house here. He was 50 years of age. He inherited a fortune from his father and is said to have set a fast pace while the money lasted. He drifted steadily downward of late years, and for several years has made a hand-to-mouth living running errands on the docks.

"Willie" Tascott, who was accused of the murder of the elder Snell, was never found by the police, although the search for him was conducted for many years.

Amos Snell was killed by a burglar whom he discovered in his house at midnight. The Snell murder was one of the sensational mysteries of Chicago 22 years ago.


