UNION GOVT. ORGAN SAYS THAT PARTY IS NO LONGER USEFUL

Montreal Gazette Speaks of Leaderless Ministry.

DESPAIR OF ITS FRIENDS

Destitute of Policy—Calls For Establishment of New Party.

MONTREAL, Feb. 9.—(By Canadian Press.)—Under the caption "The Political Situation," the Montreal Gazette, a paper which has hitherto been a supporter of the Union Government, publishes an editorial advocating the establishment of a new political party which shall coalesce and form into a dominant party "the political forces antagonistic to the fiscal policy of the United Farmers, as well as to the proclaimed policy of the Liberals." The Gazette says in part: "Having fulfilled its high purpose through the war with general acceptance and no mean measure of efficiency, the Government has manifested since the termination of hostilities a remarkable impatience to win and hold favor. The Union party has not united. The Liberal party and the Farmers' party, but who art thou? may be asked of the Union party. It is a party that has outlived its usefulness, a party that having accomplished its purpose is reverting electorally to its original elements. The art of government is most difficult under the best of auspices, but a leaderless ministry, destitute of policy, must be the despair of its friends." The Gazette then makes reference to the policy published elsewhere in its columns of a national party, sponsored by Senator John S. McEwen, and gives this new party high praise, inferentially supporting it.

RUBBER FIRM INCORPORATED.

QUEBEC, Feb. 9.—With a capital stock of \$2,000,000, the Rubber Company of Canada, Limited, has been incorporated by letter patent issued by the Lieutenant-governor-in-council. The firm's place of business will be Montreal. The promoters of the new venture are all Montreal men.

ONLY FEW REPORTS RECEIVED OF DRIVE FOR FORWARD MOVE

Results of First Day's Canvass Expected Today.

TORONTO, Feb. 9.—Only a few reports, and those somewhat fragmentary, were received tonight at the United National Campaign headquarters in this city of the results of the first day's canvass in connection with the week's campaign to raise \$11,000,000 for the Inter-Church Forward Movement. Of the five denominations engaged in the campaign neither the Anglican nor the Congregational Church reported, but it is expected that today's results will be made known tomorrow night, along with the amounts raised tomorrow by these two denominations. Fourteen Presbyterian churches reported their total being \$60,290. The Methodists' total for the first day was \$1,099,877, or 41.66 of their objective. The Baptists raised \$19,111, or 39.59 of their objective. However, these reports were only from Toronto and some sections of Ontario. It is expected that tomorrow night will see reports from the five churches from various parts of the Dominion. Over 50,000 Canvassers. It is estimated that the canvassers in the five communions number more than 50,000; the number of church members to be canvassed, over one million; and adherents of churches probably 2,500,000. Six districts of the Bay of Quinte Methodist Conference, the only Methodist district unit was over one-quarter of the way to the total tonight. Campbellford district reported \$17,822, its \$23,000 objective raised. This got the pace for the Bay of Quinte conference and Methodism throughout the Dominion.

MAN STRICKEN DUMB REGAINS SPEECH AND BECOMES A MANIAC

Robert Costello Overcome At Sight of His Murdered Wife's Body.

DETROIT, Feb. 9.—Robert Costello, who was stricken dumb when he slew his wife on Friday night, has become a raving maniac and is hauled to his bed in the receiving hospital. The confessed wife slayer, who was forced to write his confession, because he had lost the power of speech, was taken to the morgue Sunday to see the body of his wife, Eva Henderson Costello. As he looked upon the still form his power of speech returned. "Evelyn," he gasped, "Evelyn, what have I done?"

He was led back to police headquarters but the vision of his wife of the assault in which he slashed her throat, kept coming back before him, and he lost control of himself and was rushed to the hospital. Costello, formerly a street car conductor, became enraged at stories of his wife's indiscretion, and slew her as she was entering the home of another man.

ON WAY TO POLLING PLACES. Berlin, Feb. 9.—Thirty-five thousand people eligible to vote in the plebiscite to be held in the province of Schleswig on Wednesday are en route to various cities and towns in that district, according to estimates here.
