LOSS HALF A MILLION DOLLARS

Destructive Fires in Richibucto, Kent County—Town Nearly Destroyed.

MONCTON, N. B., Aug. 2.—Fire, which broke out in Richibucto at 12:15 o'clock this morning, followed by a second fire, which broke out in the barn of the Union Hotel, owned by Mrs. Zachariah Leger, almost totally destroyed the town. The estimated loss is over half a million dollars.

The first fire, a small one broke out in the barn in the rear of Peter Bernhart's home. Mr. Bernhart's barn was totally destroyed, the flames spreading to the house, which was also destroyed. From this the flames spread to the home of George E. O'Leary, and both house and barn were destroyed. This fire threatened the whole section of the town for a time, but through the energetic work of the residents it was extinguished about 4:10 o'clock.

Shortly after this a second fire broke out in the barn of the Union Hotel, barn, house and garage being destroyed. From here the fire spread to the garage of Arthur Maillet. It was destroyed, the flames then spreading to the Leblanc Hotel, purchased a few days ago by Andrew Wood of this town. It was totally destroyed, also barn and sample rooms. From the Leblanc Hotel the fire spread to the stores and freezers of Richard O'Leary and A. & R. Loggie. Stores, freezers, and warehouses of both firms were destroyed. The homes of Mrs. John Long and Michael Long were also destroyed, as were the tin shop of Nicholas Mazerall and blacksmith shop owned by David Richard.

STORES ROBBED DURING WEEK

Several Breaks Attempted and Cash and Goods Taken in Two.

During the past week there has been a number of robberies and attempted breaks in this vicinity. One night last week the Richards Mfg. Co's store at Richibucto was broken into and a small amount of change and a quantity of goods taken. This is the third break in this store in a short time.

Some time over the week-end the rear door of Mr. Davidson's store in the McLean building were forced and thieves took about \$19.00 in silver and some goods.

Attempts to enter two other stores were made but they were unsuccessful. The police are endeavoring to get necessary information and arrest the guilty parties.

In the meantime every precaution should be taken to have doors securely fastened.

Loggie's and O'Leary's freezers were both packed full of mackerel, which are a total loss.

The stores belonging to these two firms and other stores burned carried large stocks, very little of which was saved.

There was a large quantity of fishing gear, netting and equipment burned. Andrew Wood had just begun to operate the Leblanc Hotel, Monday being his first day.
