GRAIN, ETC.—The firm tone manifested the close of last week has not been continued and the market is dull. No. 1 fall has brought \$8c on track and spring \$0c, but little stock has been cleared. Manifoba is quoted at \$1.03 to \$1.05. Barley drags at \$8c to 40c. Oats have been actively enquired for at \$2c to 51c. There is absolutely nothing doing in flour and prices are easier, although straight rollers are still held at \$3.70 to \$3.75 and patents at \$4 to \$4.50.

PROVISIONS AND PRODUCE—The wet weather of the past week has militated against trade and sales show an appreciable reduction. Eggs are easier, although still held at 16c to 17c. There has been a steady demand and stocks were pretty well cleaned out. Medium grades of butter have continued to accumulate owing to liberal offerings. There is still a steady demand for the higher grades of dairy tub at 16c to 17c. while Morrisburg is worth 19c to 20c; inferior is quoted at 14c to 15c. Large rolls are quoted at 17cm 12c to 16c with ample stocks and only fair enquiry. Potatoes are weaker at 53c to 55c in car lots and 60c to 65c in smaller quantities. There is little demand for lard and quotations are easy. Dealers claim that they can secure kettle rendered lard at 8c down in Toronto. The anticipated boom in cheese has failed to eventuate and transactions are limited at 10½ to 11c per lb. Business continues quiet in bacon, hams, mess pork, etc., and prices are unchanged. 
