# THE SCAVENGING OF THE CIT

WHY SHOULD NOT THE CONTRACT SYSTEM BE ADOPTED?

ntreal Has Found It Cheap, Clean and Free of Annoyance-The City Would Be Saved the Expense of Building rema ories-The Contractors Have to Supply Everything.

The City Council is at last awak The fact that the present system of gathering and disposing of the refuse from houses and lanes cannot continue much longer. In the ald days Commissioner Coatsworth, Chair an Carlyle of the Local Board of Health nd Chairman Frankland of the Markets and

and Chairman Frankland of the Markets and License Committee visited Montreal, saw how the difficult problem had been solved there and went away satisfied that the work, to be done effectually, had to be done by contract, and the stuff once garnered burnt in crematories. But these gentlemen on their return to Toronto failed to impress up-on the council the necessity of a radical shange in this branch of the civic service. Matters, however, are approaching a crisis in this connection, and it would seem at last that the alder-men are awakened to the importance of the subject and the great need there is of some action being taken at once. In the summer a feeble attempt was made to have a patent crematory built, but this foll through. Then the city was going to erect one, and this like the preceding idea, is fast becoming extind. In both these in-stances it was not so much the building of a crematory, which was the bone of contenit was not so much the building of a bry, which was the bone of conten-the selection of the site. Montreal and Toronto.

In Montreal the whole business is let ou by contract. The contractor gathers garbage, carts it to the crematory (built garbage, carts it to the dreindery joint and managed by himself), and there sees it properly burned without the least offensive smell. He is held responsible in bonds for the proper performance of the work, and any infraction or neglect is quickly remedied by being reported to the Unio Health denertment which has superwork, and any infraction of neglect a quickly remedied by being reported to the Clvic Health department, which has super-vision of this part of the city's business. The night soil difficulty is handled in the same way. There are no filthy wagons hauled through the streets, no fights over the disposal of the stuff, but it is burnt in a fiery furnace and that ends the matter. It is only within the last seven or eight years that Montreal has adopted this system, and so well has it resulted that on no consider-ation would it go back to the old, order of things.
