## RESCUE BABE FROM BURNING BUILDING

Petrolia, July 10—A daring rescue of their child was made by Mr. and Mrs. J. Mattox, about 12 o'clock last night. A fire started from some unknown cause in the rear of their store, over which they live. It made such rapid advance on the main building that their descent down stairs was cut off by flames, and they were compelled to make an exit from the front windows by ladders.

In the excitement, and through some misunderstanding of each other the baby was left up in the burning building. Realizing their terrible mistake Mr. and Mrs. Mattox made simultaneous ascents up the ladders back into the flame-swept building. The mother returned first, bearing the child in her arms, followed by the father. Mrs. Mattox was badly burned about arms and hands. The building, stock of groceries and all household furniture were totally destroyed. Mr. Mattox's loss is partially covered by insurance.

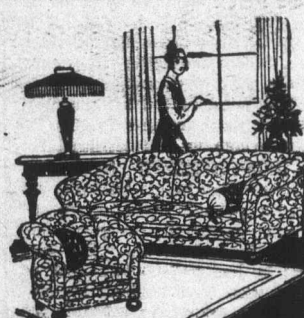

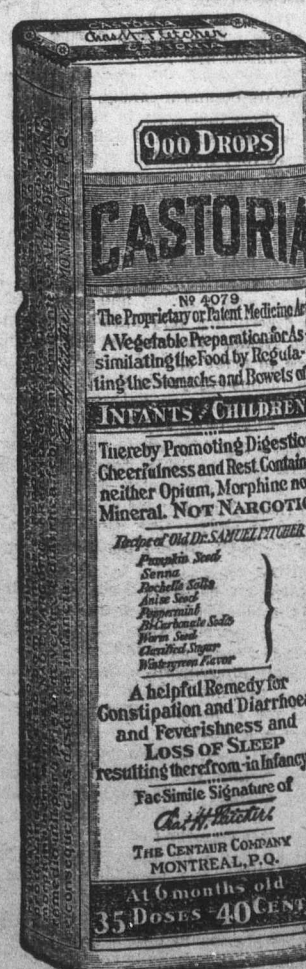
