Children when ill or ailing have the best possible care—even better than they could have were they at home—and parents are promptly notified from time to time as to their actual condition. *If you do not hear from the Superintendent you may be quite sure your child is in good health.* Children who can write themselves will send cards home every three weeks; those unable to write will have cards written for them. Requests have been received asking the Superintendent to write about children every two or three days; as we have 250 children, two letters a week would be 500, just a few too many, and he has other duties besides writing letters. If parents are uneasy about their children at any time, every letter sent to the Superintendent will be answered without delay. The "Application" and the "Improvement" columns will be filled in the 1st November paper.
