IMPORTANT DISCOVERY .- Mr. Vennor, who with a staff of geological surveyors who have been exploring in the vicinity of White Fish Lake, Pemechangs, and St. Mary's Lakes, on the Upper Gatineau, re ports that he has discovered an immense mountain of pure christaline phosphate of lime, showing on the surface hundreds of thousands of tons that will yield an average of 90 per cent. He says the two great phosphate beds running up by the Lievres and Gatineau rivers appear to meet, about 150 miles north of Ottawa, at this mountain, and the phosphate is thrown up to such an extent that the show is enormous; he believes also that the Lake Superior silver-bearing rock runs across the head waters of the Gatineau. This would corroborate the statements frequently made by Indains regarding the discovery of silver in this district.


