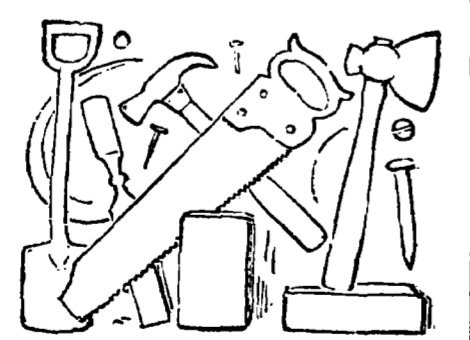
"Yes, sir," Tom Ross was saying "that dog is certainly mad."

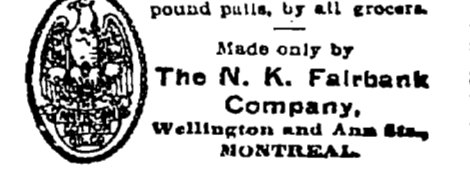
