In addition, both the federal and provincial governments will be reviewing the current array of labour adjustment and assistance programs to determine if additional funds or program changes are warranted. These labour programs currently provide financial assistance for mobility, education, training, early retirement, wage subsidies and special initiatives to assist workers locate new employment. The federal Government spent \$1.9 billion in 1986/87 on a broad range of worker programs, including the Canadian Job Strategy and unemployment insurance. A wide range of industry and agriculture programs are available and both the Ontario and federal governments have been reviewing their programs and tax systems with a view to ensuring that industry can adapt to the increasingly competitive world circumstances.
