sionist experiments have so far given better results than the deflationist, and it may be noticed that in some countries, such as Australia, Germany and Italy, better results were apparently obtained when deflationary were gradually supplanted by expansionist measures. In any case it is difficult to doubt that the steps taken in Sweden, the United States and other countries to develop purchasing power through the expenditure of public money gave an impetus to industry at a moment when confidence was at its lowest.

I simply want this main point to be established: on the authority of the bureau of labour at Geneva we have a clear finding that in the years of depression actual experience has found a program of recovery. That program is based upon the scheme of planned economy based upon controlled inflation adopted in Great Britain, the United States, the Argentine, Australia, and other countries.

It can be adopted in Canada. There is no reason why we cannot go forward out of the depression on a sure and charted course as has been done by these nations. The legislation now before us opens the way to doing that, provided the policy has the will to do behind it.

The CHAIRMAN (Mr. McPhee): Shall section 11 carry as amended?

Mr. McGEER: May I just put on record two statements that I did not have time to put in? I think the statement showing the funds appropriated—
