

*Mr. Veniot*—On Wednesday next—INQUIRY OF MINISTRY—1. Were tenders received for an air mail service between Sudbury, Ontario, and Winnipeg, Manitoba?

2. If so, who tendered and what was the amount per mile of each tender?

3. What was the estimated mileage to be flown between Sudbury and Winnipeg?

*Mr. Veniot*—On Wednesday next—INQUIRY OF MINISTRY—1. What are the arrangements under which the Government of New Brunswick and the Federal Government co-operate in the matter of immigration: (a) as to immigrants from Great Britain, (b) as to immigrants from Denmark, Norway and Sweden?

2. If any money has been paid by the Federal Government as a result of any such arrangement, between August 1, 1930, and February 1, 1931, how much and what are the details of payment?

3. How much money has been paid to the province of New Brunswick by the Federal Government to aid in repatriation, each year since 1927?

4. Did the province of New Brunswick make any representations to the Federal Government to the effect that efforts at repatriation would not or could not be successfully carried out?

5. If so, what were such representations?

*Mr. Veniot*—On Wednesday next—INQUIRY OF MINISTRY—1. How much money was expended under Federal aid to assist unemployment in the various counties of New Brunswick up to February 1, 1931, by the Provincial Government, in co-operation with the Federal Government, giving amount furnished by each government?

2. What was the nature of work performed? If by contract, what were the names of contractors and amount of each contract. If by day's work, what were daily wages for foremen and labourers, and how many hours constituted a day's work?

3. In what counties was such work performed and how much was expended on such works in each county?

4. How much money was expended in each city, town or municipality in New Brunswick for relief of unemployment under joint co-operation of the various cities, towns or municipalities with the Provincial and Federal Governments?

5. Did the Government of New Brunswick make any recommendations to the Federal Government for the expenditure of money on municipal works to relieve unemployment?

6. If so, when?

*Mr. Veniot*—On Wednesday next—INQUIRY OF MINISTRY—1. Why was the contract not awarded for the construction of a wharf at Little Shippegan, Gloucester County, New Brunswick, after a regular call for tenders had been made?

2. Is it the intention of the Government to make provision for the construction of such wharf in the Estimates for public works to be submitted to the present session?

3. Did the Government receive any representations pointing out that unemployment was acute in the district where this wharf was proposed to be constructed and that its construction would relieve very materially the unemployment situation?

4. If so, from whom?
