- 4, Years. With Messrs Garvie & Sons, Builders, Aberdeen. Scotland. learning the practical work of building.
- 1, " With Messrs Walker & Beattie. Civil Engineers, Aberdeen.
- 5, " With Wm. Curlett, Architect, as pupil and assistant, the latter two years I took charge of his office.
- 4, " Architect for the Erie Ry. New York. where I had full charge of the whole of their building operations with a staff of about thirty assistants under my control.
- 4, " With Sir Aston Webb. P.R.A. during which period I had charge of the construction of the Royal Victoria and Albert Museum. Sir Aston Webb, will at any time give me the highest references. (Cost about £1,000,000. Sterling)
