

CHOICE BERRIES ON LOCAL MARKET

More Strawberries Reach Toronto, Also Quantity of Cooking Cherries.

NEW POTATOES ARRIVE

They Are Canadian Products and the Shipments Are Becoming Larger.

Strawberries came in in slightly larger quantities yesterday, selling from 75c to 10c per box, the bulk going at 8c to 10c. Some choice berries from Michigan, Ontario, and New Brunswick, also from G. D. and Harry Patterson, Henry Oliphant, Thos. Thorley and Wm. Bourne, Clarkson, and D. Spence. Mr. Spence received the largest shipment he has yet had this year.

Cooking cherries were shipped in still larger quantities and the demand was almost all caused by the strawberry season not being over yet, and the high price of sugar preventing a large number of people from affording them. Yesterday they sold at 30c per 6-quart basket, and 45c to 50c per 11-quart basket.

Sweet cherries sold at 50c to 75c per 6-quart basket, and 90c to 1.25 per 11-quart basket.

Belknap & Son had a large shipment of cherries from Grimsby.

Small gooseberries are still practically unsaleable at 20c to 40c per 11-quart basket; large ones, which are scarce, bringing 75c.

Cabbages came in plentifully, both domestic and imported, Canadian selling at 50c to 75c per bushel.

Cauliflower is beginning to be shipped in in slightly larger consignments. White Co. having some which they sold at \$1.50 to \$1.75 per crate.

Hillocks of apples again were shipped in to White Co. and Chas. S. Simpson, selling at \$1.75 to \$2 per box.

New potatoes (Canadian) are gradually increasing in quantity and selling at 30c to 40c per 11-quart basket. McBride had a nice shipment, also beets and lettuce.

WINNIPEG, July 2.—Sir Rodmond Roblin, testifying before the commission investigating the charges of collusion between the old and the new governments of Manitoba, said today that an arrangement had been made with Valentine Winkler to extend each of the eight election contests, four on each side, thirty days.

When asked by Mr. Fullerton if the object of the deal was to let the petitioners run alone, he said: "I have forgotten about them, they should be protected."

Asked for Protection.

Before Sir Rodmond entered the box, A. J. Andrews asked on behalf of his clients, the members of the old government, that they should be protected for giving evidence.

"If this assurance were given," he said, "Sir Rodmond would make a complete statement of everything."

Mr. Justice Perdue said: "We do not know yet what powers we have for granting immunity."
