WOODROW WILSON IS MEXICO'S POPULAR IDOL Recognition of Carranza Government Results in Wave of Enthusiasm.

MEXICO CITY, Oct. 20.-Formal recognition by the United States of the de facto Carranza government resulted in all the morning newspapers of Mexico City being printed in American colors and containing extremely audatory articles on President Wilson and the American nation.

On all sides and in all circles cheers and praise for the American executive and for the people were heard.

Enthusiasm over the recognition of the Carranza government is growing and the feeling of pessimism long pre-valent is everywhere being supplanted by one of hope for the future.
