tended to the weft, by what lands it was bounded on that fide, and the connections of those lands with former discoveries, remained unknown, till Captain Cook, after his first voyage, brought back a fatisfactory decision of this important question. With wonderful skill and perfeverance, amidst perplexities, difficulties, and dangers, he traced this coast almost two thousand miles, from the 38° of south latitude, cross the tropic, to its northern extremity, within to° and a half of the equinoctial, where it joined the land already explored by the Dutch, which they have denominated New Holland.

The voyages projected by His prefent Majefty George the Third, and carried into execution by Captain Cook, have not, it is prefumed, been ufelefs. When Great Britain was first vifited by the Phœnicians, the inhabitants were painted favages, much lefs civilized than those of Tongataboo, or Otaheite; and it is not impoffible, but that our late voyages may, in process of time, fpread the bleffings of civilization among the numerous islanders of the South Pacific Ocean, and be the means of abolishing their abominable repasts, and almost equally abominable facrifices.
