The bill is very stout at the base, rather short, and of a yellow colour: the eyes seem large: the general colour is a rusty purplish brown: the rump and vent blue green: the quills are deep blue above, and blue green beneath; and the inner webs black: the tail is blue green; near the end is a purplish band; and the tip blue, so deep as to appear nearly black: the legs are of a reddish brown.
