fuperior Wisdom in the Conduct of our M—rs can alone reinstate and preserve us. Let us then examine on what our Expectations are founded, and what is to be expected from those who preside in public Affairs.

IT is not my present Design to summon up before your Eyes the Ghosts of Mal-Administration, or turn their back on the Conduct of the two Brothers, during the last Wais; I mean not now to awaken your Attention to that Flood of Pollution and Corruption, which has been let out, to deluge Integrity and Justice; I wish not to bring past Crimes to your Remembrance, squandering your Properties, and invading your Liberties, to aggravate the present Misconduct, or tread backwards those Paths which lead to unrayeling in-ly Iniquity; I will not hint the Inattention which prevailed during the French naval Armaments and Usurpations in America. Objects within the Ken of every Eye, Transactions of Yeflerday, what has lately passed by Land and Sea, shall be lain before you. Behold those with Attention, judge impartially from the Conduct in these Affairs, what is the Force of that Capacity which directs them; then remember that England is your native Land, and reflect one
