It declares "that the commercial interests of the country demand a two cent per mile railway rate." In Ontario at least the railways would lose nothing by adopting that rate. We trust it will not be long before the 2-cent rate will prevail in Canada. As for electric railways, they should be limit-

ed to 1 cent per mile.

STATE CONTROL OF THE PASS The Globe has torn a leaf out of Sin Oliver's notebook and is taking the Crow's Nest Railway into its most serious consideration. How it is weighing the pros and the cons, the ifs and the buts! Why not come out straight for state control? If the papers would join in demanding a national railway through the Crow's Nest Pass, with running privileges to all roads on equal terms, it would do more for the solution of the transportation problem than anything else.


