SOCIALISTS ARE GROWING CONVENTION INDICATES

In Less Than a Year Branches in Ontario Increase From Three to Fifteen.

In the Finnish Hall on Adelaide-street, between Simcoe and Duncan, was yesterday inaugurated the most successful convention of the Socialists in Ontario have ever held.

The reports of the provincial secretary of the society, J. G. Stroud of Toronto, showed up the almost phenomenal strides towards power and influence this organization has made during the past 12 months. The report pointed out that where ten months ago there were only three branches in Ontario, there were now 15 and all alive and working.

Toronto's increase has also been very marked, as the members paying dues of 25 cents a month now number 280, with the society divided into four branches, to wit: English, Finnish, Hebrew and Italian, with a good sprinkling of French-Canadians among the English members. The total number of dues paying members in the province runs about 800, while in addition there are a great many who are passive members, believing in the ideal without taking a prominent part in the building up of the society.

Delegates were present yesterday from Toronto, Hamilton, Galt, Guelph, Berlin, Cobalt, Sault Ste. Marie, Port Arthur, Lindsay and Brantford. A representative applied for a charter yesterday.
