

to be afterwards agreed on between the Band and the Department.

(2<sup>o</sup>) That a Bill shall be brought into Parliament during the ensuing Session, containing provisions for the immediate enfranchisement of all the members of this Band who may be found competent, and worthy of the privilege, and for the gradual enfranchisement of the remainder, as they individually prove their capacity, or attain their majority in years, - And that each individual, as he or she is enfranchised, shall receive a free deed of the land assigned them in the allotment.

I transmit also a Memorial, subsequently drafted and signed by the same parties who signed the Surrender, with a list thereto annexed of the present membership of the Band, entitled, according to their views, to share in the partition, - a Diagram, showing the proposed allotment of lands to said membership, - a List, also, of parties who are or may be claiming a right to participate in the final division of the land and funded money of the Band, but whose rights are, in whole or in part, denied, - And a Copy of a series of resolutions which were adopted at a Council of the Band on the 5<sup>th</sup> July last, and submitted and read at the late Council, in the hearing of the Hon. the Supt. Genl. and myself, as a declaration of their mind and wish.
