It appears that a gentleman who had listened to Mr. Monet's recent speech in Rhode Island asked what Quebec would do at the next Federal elections. Mr. Monet is reported to have replied as follows:—
"I do not expect to see any great change if Sir Wilfrid Laurier is the leader of the party, but the day Mr. Fielding receives Laurier's mantle of leadership the Province of Quebec will remember that it was the finance minister who forced Sir Wilfrid to decree the inferiority of our race in refusing to give to the French-Canadian Catholic minority of the West the same rights which we accord the English Protestants of Quebec province. I believe that Sir Wilfrid did his best for his co-religionists, but we will remember Mr. Fielding."
