NEGROES APPROVE OF LYNCHING

Helped the Whites to Hunt Down Davis—A Striking Letter. A Columbia S. C. despatch says:—Governor Heyward returned this afternoon from the scene of the lynching of the negro, Bob Davis, near Greenwood, recently, when asked for a statement concerning the lynching, the governor said that he had nothing to say, further than that after a conference with Solicitor Cooper of the Greenwood circuit court, he had instructed that officer to take immediate steps to prosecute the known members of the mob. As the sentiment among the best citizens of the county, as well as a number of negroes, is in sympathy with the action of the mob, it is hardly probable that the prosecutions will amount to anything. A negro school teacher of the neighborhood has written a card to the newspapers, in which he endorses the lynching of Davis. The negro citizens of Greenwood county are in regard to the lynching of Bob Davis: We, the negroes of this county, wish to say that we are with you in anything so serious as this will give assistance in what you think best. We cannot afford, as a race, to uphold anything that tends to lower our Christian or moral standing, and the quicker we show that we are ready to help track the rascal to his den, the quicker will we have the sympathy of the white men when we are intruded on. Some persons may say that negroes should not have anything to do with men in their search, but we say to them: 'You are simply needing common sense.' If there is anything lacking on the part of the negro race, it is that of self-respect, and we say that if he can not respect himself, teach him and do not be particular how and in what manner the negroes should be treated. Not until the leaders of the race establish the fact that we should join in and overtake any rascal are we in full discharge of our duty. Then let us in a race learn to respect ourselves and thereby expect it of others. We think we voice the sentiment of every respectable negro in the country when we say that the country is rid of one of the meanest, most despicable characters imaginable, and your thoughts are ours. It is unreasonable to expect the white men to respect and protect us when we do not respect ourselves. The only thing that is the right man and that is what we had, and we are satisfied. EXHIBITION DIRECTORS PLEASSED WITH REPORTS. A meeting of the directors of the Exhibition Association was held last evening to hear the report of the executive on the arrangements made for the exhibition to be held September 1 to 8. In addition to the members of the executive there were present Hon. L. P. Farris, Ald. T. H. Bullock, Henry Gallagher, W. M. Jarvis, Geo. Robertson, M. P. P. A. Dykeman, G. A. Kimball, Dr. G. A. Hebertson and W. F. Burditt. The executive presented a report and a comparative financial statement showing the expenditures for 1904—\$28,518.49, and for 1905 as credited as they could be estimated at \$28,824.14. The report explained the work done on buildings and repairs and the department arrangements which had made this possible; that whatever the public judgment may be as to the comparative merit of this year's arrangements which had made this possible, they unanimously approved of the report of the executive.
