20 CENTS A HUNDRED ADVANCE IN SUGAR

Montreal, Aug. 31.—A further advance in the price of refined sugar was announced here today by the Atlantic, Canada, and St. Lawrence refineries, a 20 cent increase per 100 lbs. bringing the present price to \$9.70 per 100 lbs.

SURVIVES BULLET IN HIS BRAIN 25 YEARS; HEART ATTACK FATAL

New York, Aug. 31.—After carrying a steel-jacketed Mauser bullet in his brain for 24 years, John S. Greiner, 48 years old, died yesterday of heart trouble in his home at 71 Boss Avenue, South Ozone Park, this week. Mr. Greiner received his wound in the Philippines in 1898 while serving as a private in the volunteers. The bullet entered his head just above his left eye and lodged as physicians described it, between his larger and smaller brain. When brought back to the United States, physicians took what was said to be one of the first X-ray pictures in this country. They decided that to remove the bullet would be fatal. Mr. Greiner had been in the postal service for eighteen years and for the last eight years had been an inspector.

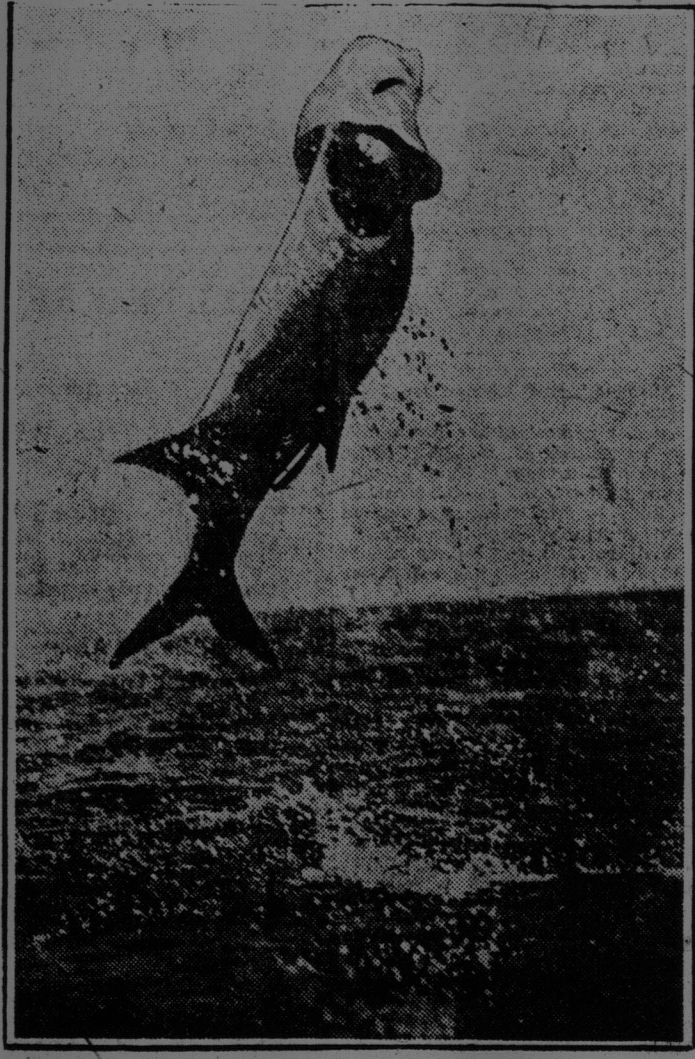

COTTON ADVANCES \$5 A BALE IN SOUTH

New Orleans, Aug. 31.—A bulge of \$5 a bale, the most important rise in weeks, was recorded in the local market today in discounting the Government's report on the growing cotton crop, showing a condition of 54.1 per cent of normal on August 25, and indicating a yield of only 10,738,000 bales.

October and December contracts both soared to 24.70 cents a pound in less than five minutes of trading following the report at 10 a.m., representing an advance of 56 to 104 points, as compared with the prices ruling just before the report was issued.

LUMBER LAND SOLD.
Juniper, N. B., Aug. 30.—Mrs. Upham, widow of George W. Upham, of Fredericton, has sold the Upham mill and lumber lands adjoining to Mr. A. W. Kyle, of Hartland. The price was said to be in the vicinity of \$40,000.

According to the letter, the sum of \$1 per ton is payable with the order, the remainder of \$10 per ton to be payable against the bill of lading.
