When the "Vedic" was at Montreal last summer she was an innovation in local shipping circles inasmuch as she was built and designed to carry thirdwas built and designed to carry third-class passengers only and was the first steamer to come up the St. Lawrence in this capacity. With broad and exten-sive promenade decks running the full length of the ship, large and airy state-rooms and public rooms, the "Vedic" has proved popular with many people traveling to and from Europe, and the idea of ships carrying third-class passen-gers only has now been definitely and concretely realized. The "Vedic" will sail from Portland, Me., to Liverpool di-rect on March 18, and from Halifax on March 19.
