R. W. L. Tibbitts, Esq., Deputy Provincial Secretary, Fredericton, N. B., Dear Sir,—On June 13 last you wrote to me stating that you had the honor to inform me that I had been appointed one of His Majesty's Counsel, Learned in the Law.

It has just been called to my attention that the recommendation and appointment of king's counsel has been a matter of newspaper comment.

As my commission has never been forwarded to me, I presume that something has arisen of which I have no knowledge, and in view of the newspaper comments, I feel that I have been placed in a position in which no member of the bar of this province should be placed. I, therefore, request that my name be withdrawn from the list of those recommended by the chief justice of New Brunswick and the chief justice of the king's bench division for appointment as king's counsel, and I would ask you to communicate my request to the proper authorities.

Such a condition of affairs as now exists in connection with the recent king's counsel designate is a reflection not only on those barristers who receive notice of their appointment, but also on the profession at large in this province, and it is as a protest against that which permits such a condition of affairs to arise that I write this letter.

DIGGING MADE EASY.

The new method of digging a ditch alongside a railroad track is to hitch a kind of scoop to the front of a locomotive. By this means twenty miles of ditch can be plowed in one day at a cost of about \$6.25 per mile.

The ditch can be thus dug three feet deep and fourteen feet from the centre line of the track, the amount of dirt removed being eighteen cubic feet per lineal foot of ditch. The operation of the digging machine is controlled from the deck of the locomotive by air valves.

Contrasted with the old pick-and-shovel method, the locomotive ditch digger has achieved what, years ago, was regarded as a physical impossibility so far as speed is concerned.
