CHINESE SHOT BY HIS COUSIN

**James Tom, Who is Held at
Amherst For Mortally
Wounding George Tom,
Says it Was Accidental.**

Amherst, N. S., June 13.—A shooting affair with serious termination occurred last evening at the St. Regis Cafe when James Tom fired a bullet from an automatic revolver and shot his cousin, George Tom, in the abdomen. The victim was immediately rushed to Highland View Hospital where an operation was at once performed. As the intestines were punctured in four places by the bullet George Tom's chances for recovery are nil although he still lives at a late hour tonight.

At first it was presumed that George Tom had inflicted the wound himself, but subsequent developments indicated otherwise, and James Tom, more familiarly known as Jimmie, was placed under arrest owing to his cousin's serious condition. Chief of Police Pickrell, on information presented by the crown prosecutor, J. A. Hanway, took charge of the dapper little celestial and he was placed in confinement over night. Seen by a reporter this morning in jail, James Tom stated emphatically with all the English at his command that the shooting was accidental. He declared that he was sitting alongside the folding doors in the back part of the building examining a new automatic revolver. According to his story there were two cartridges in the clip, one found lodged in George Tom, the other taken from the automatic by Chief Pickrell this morning. Jimmie declared that George walked through the doors at a distance of three or four feet and that he failed to see him until the gun accidentally went off and George fell to the floor. Examination of the coat shows a patch of powder burns about one inch and a half in circumference and from that evidence the accident occurred at short range. A hearing was commenced this morning before Magistrate Casey but was adjourned until tomorrow.

AUSTRALIA WILL PROTECT INDUSTRIES BORN DURING WAR

London, June 13.—W. A. Watt, the acting prime minister of Australia, according to an Exchange Telegraph despatch from Melbourne, told the industrial protection league Thursday that the Australian government intends to introduce a tariff measure to protect industries created during the war, at the approaching session of parliament. The measure would also encourage new industries and extend those already in existence. The acting prime minister said it was the intention of the government, if parliament approved, to pass an effective tariff.

Rome, June 13.—There have been sporadic strikes throughout Italy for

several weeks past in which the demands have been made for a decrease in the hours of labor and an increase in wages, while others have been in protest against the high cost of living. The most serious of these strikes being that of 75,000 school teachers demanding a minimum of two dollars daily. 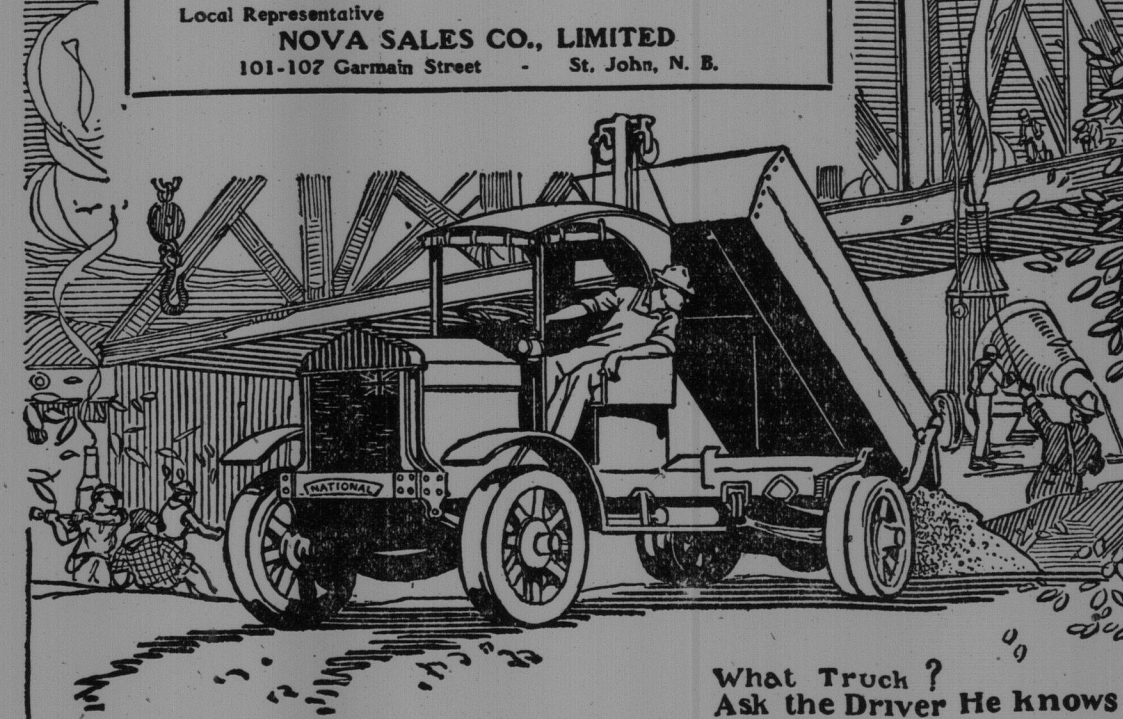
