Editor of Times: Sir—I am after learning from what I read in the St. John papers that the Chairman of the Ferry Committee is in a very great puzzle about what you people call the Transportation Problem. As near as I can make out, what you mean by the transportation problem, is how to get people, from St. John to Carleton and back without putting the city twenty six thousand and (\$26,000) dollars a year in debt. This here (\$26,000) twenty-six thousand dollars, doesn't come to me as a great surprise, as I read some time ago, how the chairman of the ferry committee, said if you would give up the rains, and let him drive the loss he would make the transportation loss, feed himself, and never ask any other man to buy a cat, or even take a bushel from the city's bin.

Now sir I have often heard that offered services don't smell good, but under the circumstances, I feel I wouldn't be a doing my duty, or to the city at large, knowing what I do, if I did not make a few suggestions, which I know if followed, would solve the whole matter for the chairman of your ferry committee. No doubt, you are aware of the fact that Belleisle Bay has a ferry, and as she has been a home of contention, and threatens to be the rock, on which the Hazen government will founder, there is no doubt but what she can be bought, and put in commission, as a ferry boat on your harbor. She is built of hard pine, and every thing else that makes her seaworthy, and propelled by near a hundred yards of canvas. In fact it has been said that she is a credit to the Hazen government, and surely what is a great credit to the Hazen government would be much more of a credit to the civil government of St. John.

I believe she can be bought for a reasonable price on reasonable terms, and we has doubt but David Jones of Cars, could be gotten for a trifle more money than you are paying your present captain, and as he and the ferry boat are both built out of some wood, there would be no harm to be after giving them a trial. I would advise them committee to take a trip to Belleisle and look into the matter, as it would only cost the city about nine ten cents a piece to send them there.
