the whole particularly interesting, it would be difficult to make any selections from them to do them justice, otherwise than merely saying, that Brother Nutter (being rather more explicit in his Journal) travelled 700 miles, preached about 70 times, and baptized 26 persons. Brother Davis' travels were something similar, and we trust productive of much usefulness.—Brother J. Burton has also laboured extensively amongst the people of Colour on the Halifax road, Hammond Plains, &c. &c. and we hope his labour of love have been blessed to many poor sinners.—On the whole there appears to be loud calls for Missionaries labours, and many effectual doors opened, and many precious souls hungering and thirsting for the bread and waters of eternal life.

Brother T. S. HARDING was also employed on a Missionary Tour in the Province of New Brunswick, but not having had any extracts from his Journal, we can only add that from Letters received, we are led to
